But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and the livestock that were with him in the ark, and he sent a wind over the earth, and the waters receded. Genesis 8:1

A word that we hear often in the Scriptures, both in the old and new testaments, is 'hope'. The psalms encourage us to hope in our God "Remember your word to your servant, in which you have made me hope (Ps. 119:49)": Jeremiah reassures us that God will give us a future full of hope (Jer. 29:11) Job tells us There is always hope for a tree, even if it is cut down that it will sprout again (Job. 14:7)

Of course all the Gospels convey a hopefilled message of salvation and new life and Paul too reminds us that hope does not disappoint us (Rom. 5:5).

Sometimes it is easy to lose sight of hope. We live in a world that has often forgotten kindness, goodness, dignity, truth, and integrity. Too often, the news tells us of the most devastating sufferings of people who have become the innocent victims of poverty, sickness, violence, and hatred. 
How can we convey a message of hope to these people? What can we do to help them? There are no easy answers to these immense problems.
