## Greetings, Kia Ora, Talofa, Bula Vinaka, Konnichi wa, Dobrodošli, Sawa dee, Failte

Welcome back to school for 2022! We hope you have had a fabulous summer break with your whanau and friends. Our staff are returning refreshed and ready for the year ahead. I have really enjoyed spending time with my whanau, appreciating the sunshine and beautiful beaches.

For those that are new to our school community, we wish you a very warm welcome to PCS! We know that you will love our kura as much as we do!

Keep an eye on communication in our monthly newsletter which is on our school Facebook page, our website and the Skool Loop app. We regularly update the "happenings" in as many places as we can to keep whanau involved in our kura.

All classrooms have SeeSaw and you would have received your new login for each child. Scan the QR code and connect to the learning and happenings in each class. This platform is where we share the learning and our reports in term two and four. Connect as soon as you can, so you don't miss anything. Contact us if you need help too.

## **COVID**

We are navigating our way through the vast amount of information outlined by the Ministry of Health and Ministry of Education. We will do our best to keep you informed of any procedures we need to have in place to ensure the safety of our tamariki and staff. Although there are different perspectives about our nation's Covid response, PCS aims

ensure we have a safe and inclusive environment. Mandated masks for year 4-8 students is a new concept for us all and we will make this transition as smooth as possible with the overall focus of keeping our tamariki safe. With requirements around isolation and illness, we ask that you keep your tamariki home if they are unwell to enable us to keep our school running smoothly. The board has good systems in place if we are put into a situation of requiring isolation of either tamariki and/or staff. Omicron is a new challenge to navigate and we will be flexible to manage this as best we can. We appreciate your support.

There are many ongoing comments and perspectives regarding Covid. We ask if you have any concerns about our Covid response and safety plan to check out our documentation on our school website. If you have any further queries at all, please come directly to the office where we can help you out. We encourage you to follow the published information rather than "word of mouth".

As we begin term 1 in the red traffic light system, unfortunately we are unable to have "non-essential" visitors at school. This makes it very challenging for all, but we continue to focus on the safety of our tamariki to get us through these times.

#### THEME FOR THE YEAR

"Care for God's creation" continues as our theme for 2022. As global citizens our students will investigate and problem solve around these issues.

Our classroom celebrations will revolve around aspects of our school values of Tika, Pono, Aroha and Atawhai which permeate through all parts of our daily curriculum and teaching and learning. To begin the term, our teachers and students will "get to know each other" and you will get a chance to share in this learning as a whanau. We strive to forge strong relationships with our students and whanau which enhances learning.

We continue to have a focus on STREAM (Science, Technology, Religious Education, Engineering, Art and Mathematics) within our school curriculum. Learning will have links to these main areas with literacy being woven throughout.

We are continuing to build on our local curriculum incorporating the NZ Histories Curriculum. We are exploring "who we are" at PCS, significant historical events and happenings that formed our school, parish and community. If you think you may be able to add to this learning, please let me know.

Other focus areas include partnership with other kura in our Te Hiku region. Manaiakalani in our fourth year, with a focus around Learn, Create, Share and will continue where we are working alongside the other schools to focus on student achievement in writing.

Our Kahui Ako professional development will focus on Te Reo Maori and building on our local curriculum.

We continue with as many opportunities as we can offer within the Covid regulations for 2022. If we have to cancel events, we will be doing so. Very disappointing for all, but safety is always our focus.

### **CATHOLIC REVIEW**

Early in the term we will be taking part in our Catholic Review from the Catholic Schools Office. Due to Covid red alert level it will be an online "review" with evidence gathered via aooale meet/zoom, video and sessions. This includes observation. discussion, evidence and review of our religious education programme and goals. We are looking forward to getting an "outside" perspective, sharing and celebrating our achievements and setting new goals moving forward. We will be gathering information from students, whanau, parish, staff, board and our community and would love your input during this time. Further information will be shared throughout the term.

# **DRS COLUMN**

Welcome back to 2022! This column will help build on the learning that is happening in the classrooms this year. Our students work in faith journals and you will see these as they are sent home throughout each term to enable you to comment and take part in the learning alongside your tamariki.

#### SPECIAL CHARACTER

If you are new to PCS you will see our Special Character throughout our leadership with our students, our classroom programmes and our celebration days. We have a busy Religious Education Programme, particularly in term 1, so watch the calendar for some events that you can join in with us

As a school we have Family Mass each term on a Sunday, and it is great to have as many students as possible taking part in the Church. Mass begins at 9am every Sunday, and those that are involved in Ministries of reading, prayer, altar service and projector, we ask that you arrive at 8.45am. Father Larry always has a wonderful homily and we know that you will enjoy it. It is important to support your child by attending Mass as often as you can.

Watch this space for our Sacramental Programme — let us know if you wish your child to take part in this very special sacrament of Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. From there, the students are able to take part as altar servers in the church which we are always very proud of.

#### **MERCY CHARISM**

We are very proud to have been established by the Sisters of Mercy. Therefore our school charism is Mercy. The children will spend the first weeks of the term understanding our charism which is based on the teachings of Catherine McAuley who was a Sister of Mercy. You will see the symbol of the Mercy cross throughout the school. The cross within a cross which the Sisters of Mercy all wore. The idea is that you look through the cross out into the wider world to see where you can help, care and assist others. The symbols of "a cup of tea" to share with others and spend time to chat and share. The "shawl" representing wrapping around those in need. The "boots" where the Sisters would walk the streets helping others. We are encouraged to think about walking in the shoes of others to show empathy and care. Our first school Mass was on Thursday and our students shared their values with Father Larry.



#### SHROVE TUESDAY

Shrove Tuesday is the last day of what traditionally was called "Shrovetide," the week preceding the beginning of Lent. The word itself, *Shrovetide*, is the English equivalent for "Carnival," which is derived from the Latin words *carnem levare*, meaning "to take away the flesh." Shrovetide was the time to cast off things of the flesh and to prepare spiritually for Lent.


Shrove Tuesday had a special significance in England. Pancakes were prepared and enjoyed, because in so doing a family depleted their eggs, milk, butter, and fat which were part of the Lenten fast. At this time, some areas of the Church abstained from all forms of meat and animal products, while others made exceptions for food like fish. As a school our senior students enjoy the tradition of "pancake Tuesday" so we look forward to sharing this with you in week 3. As we prepare to begin Lent, after a hearty feast of pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, may we take time for extra prayer.

#### **LENT**

Lent is the main penitential season on the liturgical calendar of the Catholic Church. The season of Lent is a Catholic liturgical season consisting of forty days of fasting, prayer, and penitence beginning at Ash Wednesday and concluding at sundown on Holy Thursday. The official liturgical color for the season of Lent is violet. The observance of Lent is related to the celebration of Easter. In the first three centuries of the Christian era, most Christians prepared for Easter by fasting and praying for three days. In some places this was extended to the entire week before Easter (now known as "Holy Week"). The word Lent derives from the Middle English word lenten, meaning springtime - the time of lengthening days. In its early three-week form, Lent was the period of intense spiritual and liturgical preparation for catechumens before they were baptized at Easter. As a school our students will set goals for Lent which we will follow through until Easter. Our teachings will be based on the Caritas resources with the theme "Called to be Peacemakers: Building Dreams Together". In our changing world we all need to work together to find a new way forward to transform our world into one that promotes love, hope and justice for all. What a wonderful theme for us to focus on for 2022.





# **Concerns and Complaints Process**


Most concerns can be resolved informally by discussions with the people concerned.

This is my seventh year at Pompallier School, and once again I am privileged to be working with students in Tui Class. I am looking forward to a great year of learning and fun!




# 2022 STAFF SPOTLIGHT.....MANAAKITANGA AT PCS
