These two professional learning clusters are our focus for 2021. Our students are working on "learn, create, share" with Manaiakalani. Teachers' are planning critical thinking opportunities for our students. This is through a range of literacy activities which promote multiple ways of learning based on one topic. Learning could be through text, video, blog, newspaper, rewindable by recording, voice message etc.

Our goals in Kahui Ako is to continue to build on our local curriculum through Tu Tangata Marama where our students are inspired in learning experiences rich in culture, environment and the heritage of Te Hiku o Te Ika. We are reaching out to whanau who are able to support our tamariki and kaiako by sharing skill-sets you may have. Please let us know if you can help us with our theme of Ngā kai (food - Kiwi and Pukeko), Te Ngāhere

(bush - Kea and Tui), Te Awa and Te Moana (river - and sea Kakapo and Te Kahu).

It is a great chance to connect with your child's teacher and our students were buzzing to share their learning with you. I really love the Easter celebration falling within the school term. Our children will be taking part in the Easter Passion Play. Each class has their own part as follows:



#### Kiwi/Pukeko -

- The Entry into Jerusalem
- Palm Sunday

#### Kea -

- The washing of the feet
- The last supper

#### Tui-

Jesus prays in the garden

#### Kakapo

- Peter denies Jesus
- Jesus before Pilate and Herod

#### Te Kahu

- Jesus carries the cross to Calvary
- Jesus is nailed to the cross
- Resurrection new life

The students learn so much from acting the parts in this passion play and the learning is very authentic. They all dress up in traditional costumes which adds to the joy and learning. We hope that you are able to join us for this special tradition at our school.

Our church has a very rich tradition, and the Easter celebrations are the most important of all in the Catholic Church. The week begins with Palm (Passion) Sunday on 28th March 2021. Our school is on Mass so we ask that all whanau contribute to morning tea to share with the parish. If you are able to help in the kitchen that would be great too. Mass begins at 9.00am so come and join us all.

Palm Sunday is an opportunity for our children to take part in the richness of our Catholic faith with the smell, sound and sight of these traditions. Processing to the church, waving palms and singing makes things a little more interesting for children. The next important day is Thursday at 7pm. This is when the Last Supper is remembered and is also the -Washing of the feet. On Good Friday at 3pm, is the next part of Holy Week. At this time we venerate the Cross. It is at this time that we recognise that Jesus died. On Holy Saturday there is a Vigil Mass at 8pm. Father Larry is also celebrating baptism for our community where many of our children are being baptised from school. Everyone is included so come along to take part in the baptism at this special time in our calendar. During Holy Saturday the Passion is read and remembered. Then there is the most important celebration of the year—Easter Sunday, celebrating Jesus' Resurrection at 9am on Sunday morning. We hope that you are able to join in at this special time. I am pretty confident that Father Larry will have some delicious easter eggs to share with our children over this weekend too.


