entity that have huge buying power. Each year they research the ultimate chromebook for whanau to purchase. It comes "white gloved" ready with all of the required apps and safety for your tamariki. They also have amazing insurance and warranty attached to the device. If you would like to know more about these, please contact us at the school office. There are opportunities to pay the device off over 1-3 years for all whanau. The price is to be confirmed shortly.

With the lockdowns over the past two years, online learning will become part of school education, so we hope to have as many of our students interacting on a digital platform as possible.

As we are in times of Covid, we are the Church in a different way and a different space. Some of you are online, enjoying television Mass or sharing with friends. Our children really enjoy this traditional prayer. The word rosary comes from Latin and means a garland of roses, the rose being one of the flowers used to symbolize the Virgin Mary. SIGN OF THE CROSS

In the name of the Father, † and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified; died, and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He shall come to judge the living and the dead. How to pray the Rosary

- Make the Sign of the Cross and pray "The Apostles' Creed."
- 2. Pray the "Our Father."
- 3. Pray 3 "Hail Marys."
- 4. Pray the "Glory Be To The Father."
- Announce the First Mystery, then pray the "Our Father."
- Pray 10 "Hail Marys," while meditating on the First Mystery.
- 7. Pray the "Glory Be To The Father."
- 8. Announce the Second Mystery, then pray the "Our Father."
 Repeat 6 & 7 and continue with the Third, Fourth and Fifth Mysteries in the same manner.
- After completing the fifth Mystery, pray the "Hail, Holy Queen" on the center medal.




