The Reason for the Season! We are shortly moving into one of my favourite times of the year....Advent.

The liturgy of Advent focuses on remembering Christ's first coming at Bethlehem which then directs our mind to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. The readings focus on the people of the Old Testament awaiting the Messiah, John the Baptist, heralding the way for Christ and the Blessed Virgin Mary and her maternal preparations.

The month of December is filled with expectation and celebration. Preparation is the key word for the first 24 days of December. Everyone is getting ready for Christmas — shopping and decorating, baking and cleaning. Too often, however, we are so busy with the material preparations that we lose sight of the real reason for our activity.

Christmas is a Christian feast — and now is the time to reclaim it as such! In the same way that a family eagerly prepares for a baby, we too in Advent could prepare for the coming of the Christ child.

Advent is a season of waiting and longing, of conversion and of hope. We focus on our thoughts of the incredible love and humility of our God.

Let us not forget to prepare a peaceful place in our hearts wherein our Savior may come to dwell. The best person we can turn to for help during Advent is Mary, who is Christ's Mother. She awaited the day of His birth with more eagerness than any other human being.

Her preparation was complete in every respect. Let's crown our preparation and borrow something of Mary's prayerfulness, her purity and whole-hearted submission to God's will.

Advent literally means —coming. It is a time of preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. Set on the branches of a wreath are four candles:

- three purple candles and one pink candle.
- In the centre of the wreath sits a white candle.

As a whole, these candles represent the coming of the Light of Christ into the world. The first candle was lit on Sunday 27th November at Mass.

All classrooms will have their own wreaths and learn about the traditions of Advent - such a special time for us all.

The countdown to the end of the school year is certainly approaching quickly. We keep all of our school and parish community in our prayers as we prepare for Christmas.

Our school events are another opportunity to celebrate. Hope you can make it to our Praise Giving and Candle Lighting Mass. Next year we look forward to a whole school production.

CHROMEBOOK ROLL OUT FOR 2023

If your child is in Year 4-8 you are able to purchase your own device through the Manaiakalani Trust. They have huge buying power and test these devices thoroughly. The insurance package is outstanding. See Maree in the office if you would like your own device. Payment options are available.



CHROMEBOOKS 2023

PLEASE KEEP THIS SHEET FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Purchase comprises a 'bundle' that includes:

- ★ Acer 733C Chromebook with 3-Year manufacturer's warranty (from January 2023)
- ★ Targus hard shell carry case with charger pocket
- ★ 3-year Acer Device Care Plan with nil claims excess (from January 2023)
- ★ Delivery and set up at your child's school, including Chrome console management license ready to support your child's learning.

Your Chromebook includes 3 years warranty against manufacturing defects, and a Device Care Plan providing cover for accidental damage, theft and loss. (see details below). You must opt in to this benefit which will ensure that any disruption to your child's chromebook availability is minimised.

Payments and Financing

Families wishing to purchase the device bundle up front in full can do so for \$ 550.00. Financing is available through a Credit Sale Contract with Te Hiku Education Trust.

Where a credit sale contract has been signed, the regular automatic payments must be put in place as per the table below. Please do this through Internet banking or contact your bank.

All payments are made to the Te Hiku Education Trust bank account. 12-3096-0319342-00. Please include your child's name and School in the payment reference. All financed bundles require the \$40 deposit to be paid to the Te Hiku Education Trust bank account, and a signed credit sale contract before a device can be delivered to your child's school.




